The third international symposium sponsored by the Modern Greek Studies Association will be held in New York from November 9th to November 11th 1973 in cooperation with the Institute on East Central Europe at Columbia University. # A Bibliography of Doctoral and Masters Dissertation on Greece\*

Although the bibliography of Masters Theses and Doctoral Dissertations in the area of Greek studies printed below is by no means complete, it is to date the most exhaustive work yet compiled. Mr. Giannaris' labors have been compounded by the fact that many persons neglected to give the number of pages of their paper, the date of presentation, and even the university at which it was given. Thus it was impossible to include their papers in this Bibliography. Furthermore many members of the Association failed to respond at all to his requests for information. Lack of space prohibits topics

previous to the eighth century A.D., but it is hoped that in the next issue of the BULLETIN there will be room to include this valuable information on the earlier period. Mr. Giannaris thanks all members of the Association who responded to his requests for information, and asks that everyone assist in this important bibliography by sending to him the exact title of the paper, the institution at which it was presented, the date, and the number of pages, so that in the near future a truly complete Bibliography of Theses and Dissertations can be published.—THE EDITOR

## SUMMARY OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING SATURDAY, MARCH 3, 1973

The Executive Committee of the Modern Greek Studies Association met on Saturday, March 3, 1973 at the home of the Secretary, Julia Loomis, in New York. The meeting was called to order at 10:30 A.M. and adjourned at 4:30 P.M. Present were: Peter Bien, Andonis Decavalles, Angela Hero (Fund-raising Chairman for the Columbia Symposium), Julia Loomis, Lily Macrakis, John Nicolopoulos, John Petropoulos, Harry Psomiades, and Niki Scoufopoulos. In the absence of the President, the meeting was chaired by the Vice-President, John Petropoulos. The agenda was as follows:

1. The Columbia Symposium: (a) Discussion of panel chairmen, (b) Problems of financing the Symposium. In connection with the latter, Angela Hero reported that she had raised \$1500, and anticipated another \$1500 before October, 1973. John Petropoulos gave an estimated budget for expenses totalling \$8,500. He also reported that he had applied to the American Council of Learned Societies for a grant. Since the Executive Committee meeting the Vice-President has received a letter from ACLS offering the Association \$1500. This is indeed a great honor for the Association since ACLS also supported the first Symposium at Princeton, October 1969, and does not ordinarily repeat its support of conferences which are held with any degree of frequency. Since Petropoulos will be out of the country after May 31, 1973, Psomiades agreed to substitute in his absence. All members of the Association are urged to communicate with Psomiades regarding names of persons to whom invitations should be sent. These invitations will be mailed on September 3, 1973. Address communications to Professor Harry Psomiades, 440 Riverside Drive, New York 10027. Of particular importance are names of local Greek organizations and the name of each organization's president so that fliers may be sent out.

2. The Journal: Peter Bien reported on the progress so far with the contract with the proposed publisher, Basil Blackwell, and the co-editors in England. There seemed to be enough significant problems for the Executive Committee to have another meeting at the end of May in order to discuss them.\* No final decision was made at the March meeting. All members of the Executive Committee were requested to investigate costs of publication at their institutions.

3. Local Chapters: problems and possibilities. The Executive Committee decided that the Association was not in a position to sponsor local chapters, first because its constitution did not provide for same, and second because these might undermine already existing local organizations. The chief duties of regional membership chairmen are to solicit new memberships and to look after lapsed memberships due to change of address or lack of contact. Membership drives and local activities which intend to use MGSA as the sponsor *must* be verified with the Membership Chairman, N. Scoufopoulos.

4. Importance of Offsetting and Binding past issues of the BULLETIN. Since the Association has reached the

landmark of five years in existence, it was decided that past issues of the BULLETIN offset and bound should be made available to libraries. The problem remains of how best to accomplish this, and what would be the minimum cost for 100 copies.

5. Discussion of Honorary Membership: According to the Constitution "the total number of honorary members shall not exceed twenty-five, and not more than three may be elected in any one year except the first, when the Executive Committee may designate not more than nine." Since no honorary members have yet been designated, nine may be elected at the forthcoming Annual Business Meeting in November 1973. A list of names with brief biographical data will be sent to members at least three weeks prior to the Annual Business Meeting.

6. Poros Workshop, July 2-8, 1973. The colloquium on "work-in-progress" will consist of twelve sessions with six USA participants and six from Greece. The focus will be the literary scene. (see page 12).

7. General Discussion. The issue of taking a stand as an Association about the present student crisis in Greece, particularly because of the pronouncement by Ahepa, was discussed. The consensus of opinion was, as in the past, that individual members could take any position they chose, but it was not the task of the Association to make declarations of any sort, other than its goals as stated in the Constitution.
